

Going gourmet

A national cuisine based around congealed corn porridge, bean stew, goat and copious amounts of sweet black tea has fuelled some of the world's greatest athletes, but is more practical than enticing - Kenya has never been considered much of a gourmet's destination. From January, however, Andy Stirling and Delia (née Brown) of Brown's Cheese hope to change this, by opening their home in the misty highland tea country of Limuru (half an hour's drive from Nairobi) for customised feasts based around the bounty of their biodynamic farm. Contact Delia in advance (tel. (0)728 999654 or email info@brownscheese.com) and she'll organise a tour of the farm and a walk through the surrounding indigenous forest to see colobus monkeys and rare wild otters. This can be followed by a pairing of the new local wine and microbrews with Brown's cheeses (which



have won awards around the world), or a multi-course meal of the farm's organic vegetables, poultry and livestock.

Place in the sun

Looking for somewhere special to stay? Try the **Southern Sun Mayfair** (Parklands Road, tel. (0)20 374 0920, southernsun. co.ke), a charming colonial-style hotel set in five hectares of tropical gardens in the Parklands area. The Mayfair is known for welcoming guests with traditional warm hospitality, and with bonuses like Wi-Fi, a fitness suite, swimming pool and conference facilities, it's a good option.

Jomo Kenyatta Airport is 15km from the city centre. A taxi into town should cost no more than KES 1,400 (€12,80). Negotiate the fare in advance and don't pay more because of "rising fuel costs" or "traffic jams" – Nairobi is a city close to gridlock anyway. Alternatively, take the number 34 Citi Hoppa bus for KES 50 (€0,47).
